Performance Analysis & Commentary



How did the North Square Tactical Growth Fund perform during the fourth quarter of 2025?

The North Square Tactical Growth I Shares increased 1.07% for the quarter ended December 31, 2025. By comparison, the Morningstar Moderately Aggressive Target Risk Index gained 2.38% during the period.

What factors had the greatest impact on the portfolio during the quarter?

Market movement and allocation decisions had the greatest impact on the portfolio during the quarter. Our investments in international equities and commodities showed the most strength in the fourth quarter. Equity price volatility made us trim our international and domestic exposure. Our cash position of 13% is helping to slow down price volatility in the Fund.

What sectors/types of securities provided the greatest contribution to portfolio return? What were among the strongest performing securities in the portfolio?

Our investment in international equities and gold mining had the greatest impact on the Fund this quarter. The gold mining ETF [GDX] returned 13.05% in the fourth quarter. Our next best performers were Canada [EWC] +7.64% and the EuroZone [EZU] +4.48%.

Were there any sectors which hindered the portfolio's performance? What were the weakest performing securities in the portfolio?

Our U.S. Treasury bond ETF [IEI] and Vanguard Growth [VUG] were our two worst contributors this quarter but still returned positive 1.07% and 1.82% respectively. 2025 was a strong year for international equity ETFs. Strong home market performance coupled with currency games made for excessive returns in many international ETFs. We continue to invest across the asset class spectrum and strive to maintain a diversified portfolio.

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What is your current outlook? How is the portfolio positioned based on your outlook?

Our current allocation points to a bullish outlook for the Fund. We own U.S. equities from large to small caps, European and Canadian equities along with U.S. government bonds and gold miners. We would like to invest some of our cash position and will do so when we find the appropriate ETFs to add. We will continue to monitor our holdings closely and attempt to buffer from any downside moves.

The Morningstar Tactical Allocation Category measures the performance of fund portfolios that seek to provide capital appreciation and income by actively shifting allocations across investments. These portfolios have material shifts across equity regions, and bond sectors on a frequent basis. To qualify for the tactical allocation category, the fund must have minimum exposures of 10% in bonds and 20% in equity. Next, the fund must historically demonstrate material shifts in sector or regional allocations either through a gradual shift over three years or through a series of material shifts on a quarterly basis. Within a three-year period, typically the average quarterly changes between equity regions and bond sectors exceeds 15% or the difference between the maximum and minimum exposure to a single equity region or bond sector exceeds 50%.
